N. Davy provided an overview of the report, noting that GRCA staff have reviewed the additional information provided by the applicant for Hidden Quarry and the response to GRCA's requests for additional information on model development and calibration are satisfactory. GRCA staff are not requesting additional groundwater modelling or hydrogeological information at this time. Minor comments concerning the site plan notes, trigger levels and monitoring conditions have been requested. Based on the information provided, the GRCA is now satisfied that extraction can proceed without adverse environmental impacts to onsite/adjacent surface water features and wetlands.

Board members posed questions regarding which parties' technical reports were reviewed, and the role of the GRCA in these types of applications. N. Davy responded on behalf of staff, stating that the role of the GRCA is clearly defined by legislation, and that GRCA provides technical advice to the MNRF, but does

not have authority to approve or decline aggregate applications. The Ontario Municipal Board Hearing is scheduled to commence in May 2019, and the OMB will consider any outstanding issues at that time. Chair Jowett added that the Province is the arbitrator in this matter, and that GRCA's role is mandated.

There followed some discussion on climate change, with D. Boyd noting that the watershed may begin to see more frequent mid-winter melts, which can make decisions regarding filling the reservoirs more complex. J. Farwell added that climate change discussions are necessary as we move forward.

17.2 Land Disposition - City of Brantford

The Grand River Conservation Authority (GRCA) owns almost 48,000 acres of land in the Grand River Watershed. Many of these lands were acquired for flood control projects and to protect floodplain lands. Ownership of floodplain lands was the best method of protection prior to the most current Regulation 150/06. Through the years municipalities have used these floodplain lands for parks and municipal services. Three properties have been identified in Brantford that, based on their use and proximity to municipally-owned lands, are being recommended for municipal ownership. These lands include: the portion of the rail trail and slope lands along Beach Road, the parcel of land containing

floodplain and a portion of the dike along Mohawk Street in Brantford; and, a parcel along Gilkison Street in Brantford that contains a municipal trail and municipal sanitary sewer line.
