### 1. Call to Order

The Meeting was called to order by the Chair at 9:30 a.m.

2. Roll Call and Certification of Quorum – 13 Members constitute a quorum (1/2 of Members appointed by participating Municipalities)

The Secretary-Treasurer called the roll and certified a quorum with 21 Members present. A total of 23 Members attended the meeting.

### 3. Chair's Remarks

The Chair welcomed the Members and made the following remarks:

- On August 12th Joe Farwell and Helen Jowett will attend the Waterloo Region Police Service memorial ceremony at Mill Race Park. This event marks the 20th anniversary of the loss of Constable David Nicholson and Mark Gage. Constable Nicholson died in the line of duty while attempting to rescue Mark Gage from the Parkhill Dam on August 12, 1998.
- Helen Jowett attended a tour of tent cities inclusive of GRCA properties. Tenting continues to be an issue throughout the Region, and GRCA is continuing collaboration with WRPS and the municipalities.
- Joe Farwell provided a verbal CAO update in lieu of a report on the agenda with the following items:
  - A conciliation date for union negotiations is set for August 9, 2018. If an agreement is not reached, a 'no board' report will be issued.
  - The Lieutenant Governor in Council has assigned certain ministerial powers to
    ministers on an interim basis pending full on assignments and transfers. Former
    MNRF responsibilities related to conservation authorities, Provincial parks, and
    species-at-risk have been assigned to the Ministry of Environment Conservation
    and Parks. During the transition, staff will remain in contact with MNRF and will
    be establishing a working relationship with the new Ministry.
  - The GRCA contract with IESO for the sale of hydro at the Parkhill Road dam has been cancelled. Staff are preparing a request to the IESO for a refund of costs incurred to date. The Ontario Waterpower Association is requesting the Province to reconsider this decision. In response to a question from S. Foxton, J. Farwell added that GRCA has stopped work on the project, and may consider reevaluating the project if suitable alternative options become available.
  - GRCA staff are preparing an expression of interest for funding support from the Disaster Mitigation and Adaptation Fund. The EOI is due on July 31, 2018, and successful applicants will be invited to submit proposals. GRCA is approaching this funding program on two fronts:
    - jointly with the City of Kitchener for the Bridgeport dyke
    - independently for GRCA's capital program

Funding requests require a minimum project level of 20 million over a 10 year period. The program provides 40 per cent funding and the remainder would be covered by the capital levy and provincial matching funding.
