S.Radoja presented the second draft of the 2019 budget highlighting the following:

- Changes since the September draft was presented include incorporating an approved wage increase for union and non-union staff, market wage adjustments, and changes in estimated revenue
- A brief overview of capital and operating expenditures and information about revenues and surplus allocations
- An estimated 2.5% increase to the municipal levy

- A brief background and overview of the Hamilton appeal of the December 2017 decision of the Mining and Lands commissioner and its potential impact on the budget
- An overview of 2019 special projects and their respective external funding sources
- Members discussed the board composition in light of the Hamilton levy appeal, reserve funds, revenue sources, lost revenue from the residential program wind-down, and available sources of funding to assist with potential unauthorized tenting issues in 2019
- J.Farwell noted that both the board composition and unauthorized tenting
  concerns would be addressed in separate reports to the board in the near
  future. He added that the tenting concerns are not a one agency issue, and
  that the GRCA continues to work collaboratively with partners and agencies
  throughout the watershed on this issue

#### 12.14 GM-01-19-14 - Current Watershed Conditions

M.Harris joined the meeting at 10:13 a.m.

- G.Rungis provided an overview of the current watershed conditions noting warmer than average temperatures and near normal precipitation for the long range
- GRCA reservoirs are at normal storage levels
- B.Corbett inquired about the availability of the ice-breaker at the mouth of the Grand in light of last February's ice storm. G.Rungis said that current lake data has been hampered due to the US government shut-down, and added that the same weather conditions that led to the ice storm are not expected this year.

- G.Rungis also provided an update of the January 13th jet fuel spill on Highway 401 near Mill Creek. GRCA has been in contact with MECP, who have focused clean up efforts at the spill site and downstream. On January 22nd fuel was detected downstream of Shade's Mills reservoir. Ice fishing has been closed for the season until potential impact on the fishery is known.
- In response to a question, J.Farwell said that the Ministry orders clean up and GRCA will make an insurance claim if required. G.Rungis responded to a separate question, noting that nearby wells were closed following the spill
